Towards a Plastic-Free Chepstow

Next meeting Thursday, 12th April, 7.30pm Greenman Backpackers Hostel

Significant progress is being made in a new Transition Chepstow project to work towards a plastic-free Chepstow.

As part of our effort to reduce plastic straws in town, we found sponsors to give two books about the impact of plastics on ocean ecosystems by <u>Ellie Jackson</u> to all primary schools in Chepstow. The author has agreed to send signed books with written letters, with a guide on "How to make your town straw-free" with each package. Schools will also be invited to create a sculpture which will go on public display in Chepstow during relevant events in the campaign and Ellie Jackson will help judge the school sculptures for a prize.

Amongst other actions, we are planning to show some samples of plastic-free boxes from Vegware to independent cafés in Chepstow to encourage them to switch their packaging. We are also looking to get a number of local businesses to give up 3 plastic items each.

We agreed to apply for registration as a designated Plastic Free Town under the Surfers against Sewage Plastic Free Coastlines. On 28th March Chepstow Town Council passed a resolution in line with this - the first of 5 steps completed. We aim to discuss the possibility of making Monmouthshire the first Plastic Free County in the UK in conjunction with plastic-free campaigns in Monmouth, Abergavenny and Usk.



We are investigating the possibility of registering Chepstow as a refill town. Refill operates an app showing locations where water bottles can be refilled for free. Cherished Earth, Moon and Co and Mythos are already listed. We also agreed to pursue the possibility of a county-wide approach to spread the cost and increase the impact.

We expect to formally launch the campaign through a number of events in the first week of June to coincide with World Environment Day on 3rd June 2018.

We are looking for volunteers to develop and promote activities in the following areas:

- 1. Businesses contacting businesses about reducing/eliminating plastic including straws, bottles, bags, milk capsules, sauce sachets, cups, trays, cutlery. Drafting letters introducing scheme; designing and producing stickers or similar to reward participation.
- 2. Schools taking forward the art competition including displaying art work, looking at plastic usage including milk bottles, lunchboxes, linking to curriculum.
- 3. Households information and raising awareness through social media, press, events.
- 4. Research investigating alternative technologies or products, other campaigns, current usage, monitoring progress, feedback on social media.
- 5. Fundraising to cover events, prizes, publicity, possibly a Chepstow mug/cup/water bottle, licences.

Orchard and Wildlife Trail Walk

Transition Chepstow's new Orchard and Wildlife trail will be launched as part of the Chepstow Walking Festival this year. The walk, which is around 6 miles, takes in all twelve Community Orchards, as well as other sites of wildlife interest and a section of the Wales Coast Path with spectacular views of the River Wye. The walk is mostly on quiet backstreets and footpaths, but one or two sections may be muddy, so please wear suitable footwear. Although there are some steepish sections, there will be frequent stops to get your breath back and chat about the orchards and how we care for them.

Pollinator Friendly Planter Competition at Chepstow Show

Transition Chepstow will once again be sponsoring a pollinator friendly planter competition at Chepstow Show. The aim is to demonstrate how you can produce an attractive display which is also beneficial to wildlife, by using nectar-rich flowers easily accessible

to bees and other pollinators - including old favourites such as cornflowers, lavender, poached-egg plants and nasturtiums. With growing concern about the use of pesticides in commercially grown plants, now is a good time to sow seeds for annual flowers which you can be sure are free of pesticide residues. Ten volunteers met at Tenby Lane car park in March with ideal weather conditions in place for a spring clean of the area near the Wales Coast Path in Thornwell. The litter pick was organised as part of Spring Clean Cymru 2018, a nationwide campaign encouraging people across Wales to get outdoors, be active and help clean up our beautiful country. The volunteers in Chepstow split into two groups to cover the Caerwent Lane Tunnel area and the Wales Coast Path, and the green areas and alleyways off Middle Way. Monmouthshire makes outstanding progress in electric car usage

Last year there was a 25% increase in registrations of new electric vehicles in the Gwent counties and this year Monmouthshire promises to be as good or better than last. Fully Charged, the public car charger network, has made a great difference, with 20 points spread across the county. In the first 3 months of this year they delivered 185 charge events saving about 3 tonnes of carbon. We expect this to increase month by month as the news spreads around. You are no more than 5 miles from charge point anvwhere Monmouthshire.
