Congestion Free Chepstow - Update Progress Report

Arts Hall, Chepstow School

Thursday 14th November 2019, 7.30 pm

Following-up on the previous Transition Chepstow hosted packed event on the topic last April, the pending open Public Meeting will feature the political and official planner's response to the various traffic proposals presented, and the continuing problem and issue of Chepstow's worsening traffic congestion and air pollution. Confirmed key political attendees include: Nick Ramsey AM, David Davies MP and Monmouthshire Councillors. In addition to the pressing matter of the A48 & A466 High Beech roundabout bottleneck traffic jams, and other associated highway and road junction pinch-points, necessary improvements to public rail and bus transport facilities will also figure prominently on the agenda.

There is an evident vital need to urgently implement road infrastructure developments and allied remedial actions to ameliorate wasteful traffic delays, driver frustration and associated air pollution health hazards.

Commenting, the Meeting Chairman Tim Melville emphasized the political imperative for prompt action to deal effectively with the deteriorating and untenable traffic situation. All are welcome.
